


Emsstrom Wreck Angling Zone

Fishing Mark: A 77m vessel which sank in 2013.

Species: The fish fauna is still developing but is likely to include cod, pollack, conger and bass



Skerries Bank Angling Zone


This Angling Zone has been developed by Devon and Severn IFCA in recognition of the importance and value of sea angling and to secure the area for current and future angling activities.

Species: Plaice, blonde ray, spotted ray

Skerries Bank Code of Conduct

Netting and Longlining

- ⇒ No commercial targeted fishing for plaice by any method may take place within the entire area of the Skerries Angling Zone.
- ⇒ Vessels which exceed 10m in overall length are prohibited from engaging in any commercial or recreational netting or longlining activity within the entire area of the Skerries Angling Zone.
- ⇒ All nets used within the pilot Angling Zone should be clearly marked using buoys with flags to aid efficient differentiation between pots and nets.

Recreational Angling

- ⇒ There is a bag limit for recreational sea anglers fishing within the Angling Zone of 10 plaice and 3 rays per angler per day.
- ⇒ Handle all fish carefully particularly those you intend to return to the sea alive.
